We trust in Jesus as the only One who secures forgiveness of our sins and eternal life through His death on the cross.


As our substitute, He received  $\operatorname{\sf God}$  's punishment for our sins.

Sermon Text Genesis 32:22-32

And Jacob was left alone. And a man wrestled with him until the breaking of the day.
